# Motivation letter

I would like to announce my interest for a position in the Post-Award Community (PoAC). Today I work as an e-commerce specialist at the Agency for Digital Government (DIGG). I have many years of experience as a system manager, business and system developer and process manager working with e-commerce both in the public sector as well as the private sector. I have also been a participant of SFTI (Single Face To Industry) since 2001. SFTI is a joint initiative in the Swedish public sector to promote and facilitate e-procurement and to recommend standards for the public sector. This is a unique collaboration that brings together central government agencies, regions and local authorities together with suppliers and IT-providers. SFTI has moved away from the previously used national standards and is now solely recommending the use of PEPPOL BIS.

In Sweden, all public procurements started after 1 April 2019 must be invoiced electronically (Law on electronic invoices as a result of public procurement). DIGG has issued supplementary regulations to the law which state that all contracting entities must be registered in Peppol to receive e-invoices. DIGG recommends the use of Peppol BIS Billing to live up to the EU standard for e-invoicing.

DIGG is also the Swedish Peppol authority that leads the work on the national Peppol infrastructure and offers support primarily to service providers within Peppol but also end-users like suppliers from private sector and buyers in public sector.

DIGG also advocates e-commerce implementation throughout the public sector in Sweden. Since many years the regulations for government agencies requires the implementation of all e-commerce and post-award messages within Peppol.

Since Sweden has chosen to refer its regulations to Peppol, we see it as very important for Sweden that we continue to be involved in the work of Peppol.

Therefore, I hope to be a part of the Post-Award Community (PoAC) and to be able to contribute to future work with the standard and Open Peppol. I feel it is important that the open standard and e-commerce cross border evolves to meet the participants requirements and at the same time follows the laws and regulations.
