News from MC



Membership Status – 14.03.2022

Global Growth

- Projected Annual Growth increasing 2021 5,76%, today 13,82%
 - Total membership estimate end of year: 556 Members
- Europe is the main source of growth in 2022 (62%)

Growth in countries

- Japan is the main source of growth (3 out of 13) Greece and UK coming right after
- Norway is the biggest country in number of total members (59). Italy lost members at the end of the year and was left behind (55 members)
- No growth for New Zealand and Singapore

Member acquisition trends

- Number of MAF requests has increased in 1st quarter 2022
 - 23 in 4th quarter 2021, 27 in 1st quarter 2022 (still in mid-March)

PA Market development update

• Finland

- Dialogue ongoing with a new request for further information and clarification
- Luxembourg
 - New legislation mandating use of Peppol for B2G effective from 18th March 2022 for large companies, with later phasing for medium and then small companies
 - Request received for presentation to cross-border German end users
- Japan
 - Arrangements for pilot testing presented to the PA and SPs
 - Agreed to create training programme to cover further topics
- UK NHS
 - Progress now being made towards BIS3 order compliance PA to engage all SPs with plan for compliance by end of June 2022

US Developments

Status update

- The Market Pilot is progressing according to plan. About 25 organizations participate in Wave 1 (starting April)
- Technical specifications still underway (e.g. policy for identifiers). The most complex features (multi-SML and multi-certificate Trust Model) are left for later Waves
- Governance issues will come on the agenda sub-committee on Policies, Rules and Guidelines (PRG) to kick of late March

OpenPeppol strategy

- Contribute to governance building (PRG sub-committee)
- Consider taking part in technical implementation (e.g. invoice US-based members)
- Pilot on the Peppol Network: to be decided
- Communication: Need to align with BPC regarding the consecutive sessions at the Miami Exchange Summit

EESPA #2 - What should be in the Terms of Reference

1. Preconditions

- Conditions for starting the incubation project without them, the venture has no meaning
- Both sides should express their preconditions and reach agreement on a common list

2. The Starting Environment

- The starting point in terms of specifications, governance, transactions etc.
- Both sides should agree on the Starting Environment and the Peppol Network will allow the Starting Environment to be put into production as soon as operationally possible

3. The Target Environment

• The desirable outcome of the incubation project in terms of governance, specifications, transactions, market adoption

4. Exit Strategy

• How to mitigate lack of success and/or terminate the incubation if the targets are not met



EESPA #3 - Next steps

- Negotiation team to discuss and suggest draft ToR along the lines suggested above
- Meeting with EESPA to present and discuss the draft ToR
- The negotiation team handles the outcome of discussions prepares and carries out more meetings with EESPA if needed
- When a final version of the draft ToR is agreed between the negotiation teams of the two associations, both associations seek approval from their management
- Prepare and disseminate communication on the content of the incubation project under the Extended Use of Peppol Policy to EESPA and OpenPeppol members
- Commence work according to ToR
- Timeline: Ambition is to get management approval and commence work according to ToR by end of April 2022 original ambition to get ToR approved by end of March seems unrealistic

Examples of frequent comments

- Australia (all PASR):
 - Referring to a Github to define Specific requirements is not clear as the documents in the github may change without prior notice. SP will need to adapt to the requirements without a proper process. It is necessary to have a clear set of requirements in the PASR.
- The Netherlands (Encryption/integrity between C1 and C2 and C3 and C4)
 - Encryption/integrity between C1 and C2 and C3 and C4 have never been in scope for Peppol. The business relation between the Service Provider and its customer should be the determining factor if this is needed or not.
- Portugal (Integration process. Inform the PA about new end users)
 - This section should be removed. I see no reason why the Portuguese PA should be informed about every single end user that wants to connect to the Peppol-network.



Next steps in the process

- Peppol Authorities have received the comments
- Comments will be reviewed and addressed
 - OO will discuss with Peppol Authorities possible mitigation
 - Changes may be made
- The Managing Committee will have to take the decision to approve or not the PASR

2. Reporting






Reporting architecture

The process has been designed based on the following aspects:

- Lowest possible impact and costs for Service Providers
- Reuse existing components where possible
- The extension of existing interfaces is preferred over the addition of new interfaces





Reporting BIS – the technical specifications

2 BIS have been developed:

- End User reporting BIS
- Transaction Statistics BIS

Timeline

- Currently under internal OO review
- Public review from members starts early April
- Review period: April May (2 months according to the new Change Management Policy)
- Implementation of review comments and final version of the BIS during June
- SP implementation of the two Reporting BIS July to December (6 months needed according to the new Change Management Policy)

The effective date of the new Policy on Reporting will need to fit the phase-in plan.


