Yes	<p>Service Providers must report statistics to the NZPA.</p> <p>(note: it is intended that this requirement will be replaced by Peppol centralised reporting once that is in place and fully operational)</p> <p><i>Guidance Note 07 Reporting Statistics to Peppol Authority on A-NZ</i> GitHub defines how to report to the NZPA.</p> <p>At a minimum, Service Providers must report information about transactions for New Zealand entities monthly to the NZPA:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) number of effective senders; b) number of effective receivers; c) number of transactions sent per Document Type ID; and d) number of transactions received per Document Type ID. <p>Reports shall be sent to the NZPA no later than 10 working days following the end of the calendar month being reported.</p>

Yes	<p>Service Providers must be accredited by the NZPA. The accreditation process has been implemented to help protect all New Zealand participants.</p> <p>Service Providers must complete the New Zealand accreditation process.</p> <p>This includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Due diligence checks (including insurance), • Security requirements (including a security questionnaire), and • Interoperability testing to demonstrate the ability to support the A-NZ specifications <p>There will be an annual review of the accreditation status to ensure the Service Provider continues to meet their obligations on an on-going basis.</p>
